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

The board is established to allow students to have a voice in the initiatives and decisions that would directly impact the state's youth. These students also take part in additional leadership training and networking opportunities that will strengthen their resumes.


Initiatives include:

- Statewide advocacy efforts to have the state legislature help increase access to FIRST for all Hoosier children through coach stipends and registration assistance.
- Mental wellness activities include handing out information at FIRST events about suicide prevention and mental wellness.
- Volunteering at cross-program events to promote all levels of FIRST.

2024 State Championship March 9 @ University of Indianapolis

- 7 Qualifying Tournaments
- \$250 registration fee covers 2 tournaments with advancement opportunity.
- Optional Third Plays
 - \$100 registration fee
 - No advancement opportunity
 - Plays are counted in chronological order





Event Preferencing



- October 23 (noon ET) 27 (noon ET)
- Your team must be nationally registered, with LC1 and LC2 cleared through YPP.
 - Team rosters are not required to register; but will be required to play.
- Preferencing will be via a password protected gravity form.
- Teams will be notified of their QT assignments on October 31.





Safety FIRST!

<C15> Safety Glasses – All Team members, coaches and their guests must wear ANSI Z87.1 certified safety glasses while in the Pit or Competition Area. Prescription glasses with approved Offthe-shelf (COTS) side shields are also allowed.

ARCONIC Grants Available!

Teams in the following counties are eligible: Carroll, Clinton, Montgomery, Tippecanoe & White

This grant will be awarded as follows:

FIRST® LEGO League Explore - \$500 FIRST® LEGO League Challenge - \$750 FIRST® Tech Challenge (Rookie) - \$750 FIRST® Tech Challenge (Veteran) - \$500 FIRST® Robotics Competition - \$1,500 Reminder: FIRST Grant Policy

"FIRST receives grants from various Donors which are designated to FIRST Teams. These are restricted donations with designations imposed on FIRST by the Donor(s). Restricted grants help FIRST teams cover the cost of FIRST registration and associated materials available through the FIRST Dashboard and FIRST Tech Challenge Storefront. At the end of the season, any unused restricted grants funding remaining in FIRST LEGO League and FIRST Tech Challenge team accounts is returned to the Donor's account for use at the Donor's discretion."

What this means: If you are anticipating receiving grant funds, you can still register your team, but do not pay until those funds are available in your dashboard. Unused funds are returned to the donors at the end of the season.





Grants!



This grant supports state-accredited schools in establishing or maintaining competitive robotics programs, and **applications are due Friday, September 29**, so time is running out!

Public school corporations with robotics teams from multiple schools must submit one application on behalf of all eligible teams seeking funding. So, if your district has more than one team, you must work together to submit one application for all schools/teams.
